16 looking to changing voting sites that are in schools  
17 in light of what happened in Connecticut. Since a  
18 lot of schools are closed on Election Day,  
19 oftentimes there's security measures to section  
20 things off, but it's allowing members of the public  
21 into schools. So I said there was a meeting  
22 tonight, I would just voice that concern and look  
23 into it.  
24 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Freeholder Liggio.  
25 FREEHOLDER LIGGIO: Just to report

Page 12

1 that Finance Committee met today before this  
2 meeting, and we met with the Director of Finance as  
3 the first step in review of the last year's budget  
4 experience and also preparation for the 2013 budget.  
5 Our first step, we reviewed revenues from the past  
6 year, and actually, the Finance Director provided  
7 with us a comparison of the last three years, and  
8 while of revenues look pretty good, the experience  
9 was very good, and she did point out that there was  
10 some areas where it looks better than we expected  
11 because there was some unusual circumstances we  
12 produced these revenues in, but overall, the revenue  
13 picture looked pretty good. I think our next step  
14 would be start reviewing appropriations in  
15 anticipation of the introduction of the budget.  
16 That's it.  
17 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: I want that thank  
18 you and Freeholder Cifelli for getting a lot of  
19 information and answering all questions. It was a  
20 very informative meeting.  
21 FREEHOLDER DUBLIN: I've got one.  
22 Today on Exchange Place, there was a rally. I guess  
23 it was SEIU 1199 on Bank of America foreclosures,  
24 and when I walked into the Hub, the financial  
25 district today, Bank of America was open. When I

1 went back to talk to managers in there about their  
2 foreclosure process, the bank was closed. They are  
3 still refusing to deal with issues that, you know,  
4 concern the community. I know the next time you're  
5 going to have a banking meeting, I would like to be  
6 present because there are questions I want to ask  
7 Bank of America.  
8 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Freeholder O'Dea.  
9 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Mr. Chairman, we  
10 expect to have one in three weeks. Part of what  
11 we're going to do, we're going to require all banks  
12 to provide us information on what their policy is  
13 related to foreclosure prevention or foreclosure  
14 assistance as it relates to general policy as well  
15 as it relates to Hudson County. You know, for the  
16 past several years, we've grappled with Bank of  
17 America. We have pushed to sever our ties with  
18 them.  
19 Mr. Administrator, I think that -- I know  
20 we've taken mostly all of our funds out of there. I  
21 know that, you know, there was a couple of small  
22 accounts that needs to kind of be there because of  
23 the process of it. I think we kind of have to make  
24 a statement with this bank, and based on that  
25 historical issues that continue concerning not only

Page 14

1 the foreclosures, but where they have branches where  
 2 they decide to discriminately just close branches,  
 3 et cetera, there not customer-friendly. They are  
 4 not urban, low-income-area-friendly. I think that  
 5 this year our issue is going to be even though it  
 6 may be low income, I know maybe some of them have  
 7 over a million dollars. We need to engage our  
 8 congressional leaders and delegates to take care of  
 9 that.

10 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Thank you.

11 THE CLERK: Are there any comments  
 12 from the Chief of Staff to the County Executive?

13 MR. GAUGHAN: Mr. Chairman, I want to  
 14 take the opportunity on behalf of the County  
 15 Executive to congratulate Jeff Dublin. Myself and  
 16 our staff are very proud. Jeff, you've made Hudson  
 17 County very proud and the County Executive and I  
 18 will be with you on Tuesday at the Statehouse.

19 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Thank you.

20 THE CLERK: This is the time for  
 21 anyone present to address the Board on any matter of  
 22 public interest. Please remember to limit your  
 23 comments to five minutes.

24 Ms. Catherine Grimm.

25 MS. GRIMM: Good evening, everyone.

Page 15

1 Winter has finally arrived. Obama and Hillary  
 2 Clinic have been working with the United Nations  
 3 pertaining to several treaties. One is the Law of  
 4 the Sea. That affects our waters in the Pacific,  
 5 the Atlantic, the Great Lakes, the Gulf, the  
 6 200-mile limit. It gives the United Nations control  
 7 over those area. If anybody from our country wants  
 8 to drill, they have to pay the United Nations and  
 9 pay royalties to the United Nations. Any other  
 10 country can come in and drill also.

11 It also affects the fishing industry, same  
 12 thing, our space, code of conduct. A lot of that  
 13 pertains to the junk that's flying around there from  
 14 repairing the space shuttles and everything. The  
 15 international criminal loophole, if our country was  
 16 to be invaded, we would have to under this, go to  
 17 the United Nations in order to retaliate. We would  
 18 not be able to shoot back until the United Nations  
 19 approves us doing so. Anyone that does so can be  
 20 brought up on international criminal charges,  
 21 including our military.

22 Now, the rights for children, we have  
 23 rights for children in this county and for  
 24 handicapped in this country. Under the  
 25 International United Nations code, it does not mean

1 that other countries will accommodate those same  
 2 laws.

3 Now, also small arms control, that's  
 4 supposed to stop smuggling from country to country,  
 5 but also there is the Bureau of Affairs, 1961, in  
 6 this country. I don't have the number with me right  
 7 now. It calls for the complete disarmament of the  
 8 populous under the guise of a peaceful world. We've  
 9 never gone to war with children of war other than  
 10 the Civil War basically. Other countries, in fact,  
 11 North Korea is doing another missile test, and now  
 12 they have a long-range missile which can hit Alaska  
 13 with a dirty bomb.

14 As far as gun control, hysteria causes  
 15 problems later on. We have gun control. We have to  
 16 enforce the laws that are out there for the illegal  
 17 guns, and to increase the penalties for those that  
 18 are carrying them and using them, that includes  
 19 juveniles even as young as thirteen years old. They  
 20 are packing. They are going to have to learn the  
 21 consequence of their actions. This is something  
 22 that should be taught in schools, more so than sex  
 23 education that's being taught now. Thank you.

 25 matter of public interest?

2 MR. HALLANAN: John Hallanan, 111  
 3 Clinton Avenue, Jersey City.

4 THE CLERK: Spell your last name.

5 MR. HALLANAN: H-a-l-l-a-n-a-n. I  
 6 would like to talk to about the Lincoln Highway;  
 7 2013 is the 100th anniversary of the Lincoln  
 8 Highway. The Lincoln Highway was, I guess,  
 9 organized in 1913, by Carl Fisher, president of the  
 10 Indianapolis Speedway and later developer of Miami  
 11 Beach; and Henry Joy, president of Packard Motor Car  
 12 Company. It was their idea that personal  
 13 transportation could be used for tourism. At that  
 14 time maybe a train was the only way to go from coast  
 15 to coast. They developed the idea of the Lincoln  
 16 Highway.

17 It did come through Hudson County. It  
 18 went from Times Square to the river, ferry to  
 19 Pershing Road, up Pershing Road to Hudson Boulevard,  
 20 went south and turned right on Communipaw Avenue. A  
 21 lot was changed when the Holland Tunnel opened. New  
 22 Jersey changed Hoboken Avenue to Van Winkle to  
 23 Broadway to 1 & 9.

24 So it's the 100th anniversary, and there  
 25 are people in the organization that are planning two

Page 18

1 caravans, one to start from San Francisco, west to  
 2 east, and one to start from here and go meet in  
 3 Nebraska to have a party of some sort. That's in  
 4 June. Cancellation of the Formula One allows  
 5 Pershing Road and the Boulevard to be used for  
 6 people in this caravan. They're having a meeting in  
 7 New Jersey Saturday, February. They're meeting to  
 8 talk about it. I think it might be a good idea for  
 9 tourism in the County and to recognize the  
 10 historical process to do something about the Lincoln  
 11 Highway.

12 This is a sign that used to hang up from  
 13 here to San Francisco. So I just wanted to bring  
 14 that up to everybody's attention. It might be a  
 15 good thing to hang some of these signs on the  
 16 Boulevard where the east-west streets come through,  
 17 and people can come to the Boulevard, go left and  
 18 right if they want to travel to the highway. There  
 19 is a section of the road between the Memorial Bridge  
 20 and bridge over the Passaic where you can see  
 21 Lincoln Highway on top of the buildings. I want to  
 22 just bring that to your attention and see what  
 23 happens. Thank you very much.

24 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Sir, did you meet  
 25 with Bill LaRosa of Cultural Affairs?

1 MR. HALLANAN: I sent him an e-mail.  
 2 He said he would send it to Mr. Antun and suggested  
 3 I come to the Freeholders meeting and tell everybody  
 4 at once instead of sending e-mails that will get  
 5 lost.

 7 coordinate a meeting with yourself and Mr. LaRosa?  
 8 Obviously, we have authorized a significant

 22 seen reports in the newspaper.

23 FREEHOLDER MUNOZ: Officially, we  
 24 have nothing?

25 MR. ANTUN: I have not received

1 anything for it. I don't know if the mayors of West  
 2 New York or Weehawken have received it.

3 FREEHOLDER MUNOZ: We haven't  
 4 received any payments from the Formula One?

5 MR. ANTUN: No.

6 FREEHOLDER MUNOZ: How does it work?  
 7 So Hudson County would get paid when the actual? I  
 8 was asking how is that stipulated?

 17 being recorded, can it be submissible in court?

18 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Counsel Florio.

19 MR. FLORIO: I don't want to give an  
 20 evidentiary opinion to the speaker. I really am not  
 21 comfortable to give that opinion to the speaker.

22 FREEHOLDER MUNOZ: You could record  
 23 it. It is a public meeting.

24 MS. WAITERS: Thank you.

25 MR. FLORIO: I'm sorry, Patricia.

3 He sent me a letter back, and I have it

 23 all had your heads down. No one could look at my  
 24 face. You didn't do anything, Freeholders, but it  
 25 don't look good for paid government officers, and I
