I'll read the notice of Public Hearing into 5 the record. Notice of Public Hearing, County of 6 Hudson, Thursday, July 18, 2013, 5:00 p.m., Board of 7 Chosen Freeholders, Administration Building Annex, 8 567 Pavonia Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey. Copies 9 of this notice were published in the Star Ledger on 10 June 25th, 2013, and the Jersey Journal on June 11 27th, 2013. 12 Proposed regulations for the 13 prequalification of bidders relative to the 14 restoration of the Lincoln Park Fountain in Lincoln 15 Park in Jersey City. The purpose of this public 16 hearing will be to provide an opportunity for the 17 public to be heard relative to the proposed 18 prequalification regulations for the restoration of 19 the Lincoln Park Fountain located in Lincoln Park, 20 in Jersey City New Jersey. 21 General description of the project, the 22 Hudson County Lincoln Park is located in Jersey 23 City, New Jersey. There 12 is one item. There is one item on the agenda. The 13 resolution is entitled, Resolution approving a 14 prequalification process for potential vendors for 15 the restoration of the Lincoln Park Fountain, 16 Lincoln Park in Jersey City. Is there a sponsor on 17 this item, Mr. Chairman? 18 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Sponsored by 19 Freeholder O'Dea. Second by Freeholder Dublin. 20 THE CLERK: At this point a motion to 21 open the Public Hearing on this resolution would be 22 in order. 23 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Motion by 24 Freeholder O'Dea. Seconded by Freeholder Dublin. 25 THE CLERK: All in favor say aye.</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">Page 5</p> <p>1 to the Secretary of the Interior standards for the 2 treatment of historic properties. The scope of work 3 consists of a single contract for the restoration of 4 the historic fountain structure, replacement of 5 fountain basin, construction of new pump building, 6 replacement of plumbing and lighting system for the 7 fountain, new filtration and recirculation system, 8 and all general conditions, permits and fees, bonds 9 and insurance, as will be described in drawings and 10 specifications 11 Principle activities of the project 12 include: 13 1. The restoration work of the fountain 14 structure at the center of the basin, including 15 replacement of all sculptural elements of the 16 fountain, seashells, dolphins, frogs, and 17 allegorical human figures, using glass fiber 18 reinforced concrete, replicating the original 19 concrete material. The remaining concrete of the 20 fountain structure will be cleaned; and cracked and 21 deteriorated surfaces rebuilt and restored. 22 2. The basin concrete floor walls will be 23 replaced with high-strength gunite concrete, 24 reinforced with epoxy-coated reinforcement. 25 3. A new building structure will be</p>

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1 constructed next to the fountain to house new water
 2 recirculation and filtration system.
 3 4. The entire plumbing system for the
 4 fountain will be replaced with non-corrosive
 5 materials.
 6 5. Electrical work shall include
 7 replacement of all electric equipment, including
 8 submerged and surface-mounted light fixtures,
 9 conduits and conductors and upgrading of existing
 10 electrical services.
 11 The proposed regulations for the
 12 prequalification of bidders for the project were
 13 available prior to this meeting by contacting the
 14 Office of the Clerk of the Hudson County Board of
 15 Chosen Freeholders.
 16 Please take further notice that the
 17 subject proposed Bidders Prequalifications
 18 Regulations for the project have been submitted to
 19 and preliminarily approved by, pending the public
 20 hearing and adoption by the Board of Chosen
 21 Freeholders by Resolution, by the New Jersey
 22 Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local
 23 Government Services, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-25.
 24 Please take further notice that the Board
 25 of Chosen Freeholders may take action by way of

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1 Resolution after the public hearing portion on the
 2 proposed bidders prequalification regulations at the
 3 July 18th, 2013 meeting.
 4 Are there any speakers on the proposed
 5 regulations? Please state your name for the record.
 6 MS. BURKE: Charlene Burke. I'm the
 7 president of West Bergen Lincoln Park Neighborhood
 8 Coalition, and I applaud the County for the
 9 restorage of this fountain and looking at the
 10 qualifications of those people who will be involved
 11 in this particular historic preservation's
 12 background.
 13 This is a jewel not only to the park
 14 system, but certainly to my neighborhood, and it's
 15 because of Lincoln Park that we have experienced a
 16 tremendous surge in people relocating from the
 17 downtown redevelopment area of Jersey City to our
 18 neck of the woods, and certainly going forward, we
 19 would love to see that this fountain be restored to
 20 its previous glory.
 21 When it was first designed and built, it
 22 was world-renown for its use of cement, as it was
 23 the largest cement structure in the world that was a
 24 fountain. Certainly, there are comparable fountains
 25 in the world today, but I don't think there is any

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1 on the east coast that even compare with our
 2 fountain in Lincoln Park, really its uniqueness.
 3 I again applaud the County for looking for
 4 the right individuals who, in fact, will make this
 5 as beautiful as it was when it was first built. I
 6 appreciate that. I want to say thank you from my
 7 entire neighborhood.
 8 THE CLERK: Additional speakers?
 9 There appear to be none. A motion to close the
 10 public hearing would be in order.
 11 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Motion by
 12 Freeholder Liggio. Second by Freeholder Dublin.
 13 THE CLERK: All in favor, opposed?
 14 (The Board votes unanimously in favor to
 15 close the hearing.)
 16 THE CLERK: The hearing is closed.
 17 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Mr. Chairman.
 18 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Question,
 19 Mr. O'Dea.
 20 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: A couple
 21 questions, the architect is here. What, if
 22 anything, is proposed as historical experience that
 23 will be required for a potential bidder? Will there
 24 be a requirement that as part of the
 25 prequalification process, a firm will have to

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1 provide what their experience is in historic
 2 restoration?
 3 MR. VOINIER: Yes, Freeholder. My
 4 name for the record is Randall Voinier. I'm an
 5 employee and an engineer at the Hudson County Parks
 6 Division. Yes, the criteria that's spelled out for
 7 prequalifying perspective bidders, they would be
 8 required to demonstration and verify the successful
 9 experience in project supervision and administration
 10 of historic preservation projects, at least two
 11 projects they should be involved in involving
 12 restoration or replacement or preservation of
 13 historic concrete clay and masonry and terra cotta
 14 ornamental structures at separate historic buildings
 15 or sites.
 16 This really pinpoints similar types of
 17 work that's similar what we're trying to achieve.
 18 That's been written in the criteria that will be
 19 used for the prequalification.
 20 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Are you the person
 21 to best answer the timing from here going forward?
 22 What are some of the time schedules of the
 23 prequalification process?
 24 MR. VOINIER: As I understand it from
 25 our architect, we are anticipating review time once

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1 I get all of the documents together and submit them
 2 to the DCA, we expect they have a 30- to 40-day
 3 return time, probably assuming again all of the
 4 documents are together either by tomorrow or Monday,
 5 it will probably be toward the end of August that we
 6 get that from DCA.
 7 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: And at that point
 8 you can just start prequalification process,
 9 correct?
 10 MR. VOINIER: Yes.
 11 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: How long does that
 12 process take?
 13 MR. VOINIER: We will probably look
 14 at sometime in September to contact and get in some
 15 of the more well-known contractors that we know of
 16 prequalified. We're going to advertise also the
 17 prequalification process, maybe even in national
 18 publications. We've been thinking about that in our
 19 meetings. We're looking to bid the project probably
 20 sometime in late September or October. I do have a
 21 schedule if you hold on for a second. I do have
 22 some dates.
 23 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: The statue will be
 24 replicated as it or as Bill O'Dea?
 25 MR. YANNAZZO: Robert Yannazzo, Chief

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1 Architect. For the most part, it's being reproduced
 2 as is. There are some alterations that will be
 3 done. You know, it's the fountain. As the Clerk
 4 had read in the prequalifications and the scope of
 5 work, it is figures and frogs, all sorts of things
 6 that surround the fountain itself. Those will be
 7 reproduced, but not necessarily in the same material
 8 as they were.
 9 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: So not the original
 10 frogs?
 11 MR. YANNAZZO: What we don't have is
 12 original drawings. They're being reproduced by the
 13 architect in order to do the project.
 14 MR. VOINIER: Actually, just to add
 15 to that, there is going to be a process where they
 16 add ornamental figures, and all of the figures are
 17 going to be replicated and stored via a laser
 18 process by the architect. So it can't get much
 19 closer than that. They're actually going to
 20 physically do a 3D laser recording of each of these
 21 projects in the factories, in the shop.
 22 To get back to your question, Freeholder,
 23 about the time line, we're looking at a
 24 prequalification process once we get back our final
 25 approval from DCA, around September 4th, where we

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1 will have a prequalification process held at the
 2 site. What we'll do is represent the plans and the
 3 specifications, and we will have an on-site visit to
 4 the fountain. Then by September 17th, the
 5 documents, about two weeks away, the
 6 prequalification documents by the perspective are
 7 due into the County. The week of September 18th to
 8 September 23, the submitted prequals will be
 9 reviewed by the County, and a list of qualified
 10 bidders, one or many, will be approved by the
 11 County.
 12 By October 1st, we're looking to
 13 distribute the bid documents to the qualified
 14 bidders that we've established. October 22nd, we're
 15 looking for the bids to be received. Between
 16 October 23 and November 4th, we're looking to
 17 evaluate the received bids and recommend the award
 18 of the successful contractor, and we're appointing
 19 the November 26th Board of Freeholder meeting or the
 20 December 12th Board meeting to petition the Board to
 21 approve the final contract.
 22 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: What we're looking
 23 at is Spring '14 construction?
 24 MR. VOINIER: We are looking around
 25 early January for demolition.

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1 MR. YANNAZZO: And as Randy
 2 mentioned, there will be fabricated designs as well,
 3 with shop drawings as well as fabrication by a
 4 fabricator for the fountain itself.
 5 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: What is the expect
 6 anticipated construction, anticipated construction,
 7 six months, nine months, twelve months?
 8 MR. VOINIER: We received an estimate
 9 from the architect. It's going to be approximately
 10 six, six months, obviously we would like to, again,
 11 weather permitting.
 12 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Start in March,
 13 finished in October or November?
 14 MR. VOINIER: As I understand it,
 15 we're working around a good season for the large
 16 pool area, not the figures and dolphins and such to
 17 be around the month of May because that seems to be
 18 the best weather conditions for this type of work,
 19 not as much rain, temperatures fine. We're trying
 20 to work around to demo early and have the pour
 21 around May. Of course, it will be done sometime
 22 after May.
 23 MR. YANNAZZO: We had an unusually
 24 rainy June this year. We can have an unusually
 25 rainy May next year.

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1 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Those are all of
 2 the questions I have.
 3 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Any other
 4 questions? Thank you very much.
 5 Mr. Clerk.
 6 THE CLERK: Roll call on the
 7 resolution?
 8 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Yes.
 9 THE CLERK: Freeholder Dublin.
 10 FREEHOLDER DUBLIN: Yes.
 11 THE CLERK: Liggio.
 12 FREEHOLDER LIGGIO: Yes.
 13 THE CLERK: O'Dea.
 14 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: Yes.
 15 THE CLERK: Rivas.
 16 FREEHOLDER RIVAS: Yes.
 17 THE CLERK: Chairman Romano.
 18 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: Yes.
 19 THE CLERK: That concludes the items
 20 of business on the special meeting agenda. A motion
 21 to adjourn is in order.
 22 DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR COTTER: I'm
 23 sorry, Mr. Chairman. I wanted to bring your
 24 attention to an issue that we have with an ongoing
 25 contract. It has to with a paving project.

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1 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: We can't discuss
 2 that.
 3 MR. FLORIO: It can be discussed, but
 4 no action can be taken.
 5 DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR COTTER: I
 6 wanted to alert. I just want to alert you. This
 7 was not part of the Public Resources Committee
 8 meeting. There was an error in the calculation of
 9 the amount of asphalt anticipated in the project.
 10 It says that -- in Bayonne, the Bayonne project
 11 that's going on. It's close to being at a
 12 standstill because there is not enough -- there is a
 13 change order that's needed to be voted on.
 14 Part of the problem with stopping the work
 15 at this juncture is that the entire project has been
 16 milled already. If we have to wait to move forward
 17 until the time that's needed for an official vote to
 18 approve the change order, the project will shut down
 19 and will remain in that position. So the
 20 Administration is planning on moving ahead with
 21 ordering more asphalt for this project and
 22 presenting the change order to the Board at the
 23 August meetings.
 24 FREEHOLDER LIGGIO: I saw the e-mail.
 25 I had the e-mail on that. This depends on the

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1 project getting done.
 2 CHAIRMAN ROMANO: I received that
 3 e-mail. There is an explanation. Obviously, I
 4 concur with Freeholder Liggio.
 5 Freeholder O'Dea.
 6 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: I don't want to
 7 speak on it. We can deliberate it in the future.
 8 MR. FLORIO: The discussion is
 9 appropriate.
 10 FREEHOLDER O'DEA: I respectfully
 11 disagree with my counsel, and I will refrain from
 12 having this discussion.
 13 DEPUTY ADMINISTRATOR COTTER: Thank
 14 you, Mr. Chairman.
 15 THE CLERK: A motion to adjourn is in
 16 order, Mr. Chairman.
 17 Motion by Dublin. Second by Liggio. The
 18 meeting is adjourned.
 19 (Whereupon the proceeding is then
 20 concluded at 5:21 p.m.)
